

## AGM & SGM February 7th 2021

The Stirling Players AGM was held on February 7th 2021. It was attended by 19 interested people. A Special General Meeting was scheduled to follow the AGM to allow members to vote on acceptance of a revised version of The Stirling Players Inc. current Constitution.

Following the difficulties encountered in forming a committee for 2020, the new Management Committee decided to appoint a subcommittee to undertake a review of the current Constitution and develop a Governance Policy outlining the


practicalities and procedures related to the everyday operation of the group - a document that could be amended to reflect changes in policy and procedure in a timely way.

The Constitution content was simplified in compliance with the requirements of the relevant Act, and an amended draft version sent to members for comment and ultimate approval. After discussion, the *draft Constitution was accepted and will be implemented* once the Government approval process is completed.

Twelve information kits, clearly outlining the responsibilities & requirements of the production team roles have been collated, printed and ring-bound for distribution to the current production team. These will be retained by The Stirling Players for future use and amendment as required.

A motion to slightly increase annual *membership fees* - Full \$32 to \$35 & Conc \$27 to \$30 was also accepted by members and will come into effect in 2022. Membership fees will continue to include 2 complimentary tickets.

## Current Production—'The Hypochondriac' by Moliere

People have been laughing at The Hypochondriac for nearly 350 years. They will be at it again at the Stirling Community Theatre in September, when The Stirling Players stage Molière's classic farce.

The Hypochondriac, which opened in 1673, was Molière's last play, satirising the wealthy French bourgoisie and the medical profession of the time. He himself played the lead role but was genuinely ill with tuberculosis and died backstage after one of the performances. The play has been revised in various forms many times since then, in theatres from

Russia to the US. The Stirling Players' production is based on the translation by Charles Heron Wall, a nineteenth century school teacher in England, known for his translations of several of Molière's plays.

"I feel we need a bit of a laugh at the moment," Director, Angela Short says.

"Why did I choose this play? Firstly because I love Molière and it is very funny."

She says she aims to bring together elements of Commedia dell'arte, Pantomime French-style and black comedy.

"I love how life can be quite farcical and yet very real. That is what we are aiming for." It is still early days in rehearsal, so we are saying 'Push it as far as you can.'

"The excellent actors we have in this production are really going for it! Molière did not hold back on his use of toilet humour in his plays, and I feel it would be rude not to appreciate it."

The play opens on Friday, September 10 at the Stirling Community Theatre in Avenue Road Stirling. It runs for three weekends, with the last night on Saturday September 25.



### March Production 2022 — Amy's View by David Hare



Amv's View takes the audience on a tense and emotional journey between a strong mother and her loving daughter. The action takes place over a sixteen year period, from 1979 – 1995 and is set in England.

West Well-known End actress, Esme Allen, receives a visit from her daughter Amy, together with her new boyfriend, Dominic Tyghe. This sets in motion a series of events which only fully

come into shape sixteen vears later.

David Hare is one of Britain's most internationalperformed playwrights and Amy's View is a powerhouse of a play.

It premièred in 1995, and after a sold-out season at the National, transferred to the West End, & later with a revival to Broadway in 2006 which subsequently went on tour in Britain.

To be directed by Tim Williams for The Stirling Players, the cast includes Joanne St Clair. Rose Harvey, Jill Morrell, Steve Marvanek and Jackson Barnard. The role of Dominic is still to be cast

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## September Production 2022— Shakespeare (abridged)

We are excited to announce a very different show for our second production in 2022; -'The Complete Works of William Shakespeare' (abr) written by Adam Long, Daniel Singer, and Jess Winfield, collectively known as 'The Reduced Shakespeare Company' three-man a comedy troupe that takes long, serious subjects and reduces them to short, sharp comedies. It will be directed for us by Jethro Pidd.

The show is a fast-paced, romp through the Bard's plays parodying all 37 of his plays (plus the sonnets!) in less than two hours and in two acts! Done with such delight, they are sure to win over even the most sceptical.

The characters run across the stage and keep you guessing how they will pull off the next play. Clever use of interesting costumes adds to the fun and the actors speak directly to the audience during much of the show.

Improvisation forms an integral part of performances with the actors deviating from the script and initiating spontaneous conversations about the material with each other and with the audience. Each performance can differ even with the same cast!



Later she had the unique experience of being elected the first female, and first Australian, President of the Himalayan Amateurs (HAMS) in Kathmandu, where, for 4 years, she reported handling as much drama off stage as on!

In recognition of her many years of commitment to The Stirling Players, Lori was awarded a Life Membership so will remain connected.
